Minimum Wage Hurts Beginners

Segment Length: 4:35 Minutes

Lesson Description:

Should the minimum wage be raised? Should minimum wage even exist? What's the history behind this decades-old concept? Nowadays, minimum wage is commonly accepted as a plus for lower-wage workers, but is there a downside? Who pays the price? This video looks at the pros and cons of minimum wage.

Concepts & Key Terms:

Minimum wage – The lowest hourly wage an employer can pay an employee. The federal government sets a minimum wage that applies throughout the United States, and many states and even some cities have enacted higher minimum wages.

Living wage – Defined by some as the minimum income necessary for workers to meet their basic needs, and by others as a wage high enough to maintain a normal standard of living. Generally considered the level of pay that allows people to pay local costs for food, childcare, health insurance, housing, transportation and other necessities without government assistance.

Entry-level job – a job that is primarily held by someone just entering the work force with little to no experience and/or minimum skill level.

Objectives:

Students will be able to:

- discuss pros and cons of increasing the minimum wage.
- explain the racist history of the minimum wage.
- evaluate the arguments for and against an increased minimum wage.

Preview Activity and Questions:

Use Think, Pair, Share to have students answer these questions:

What might be some positive effects of increasing minimum wage? What might be some negative effects of increasing minimum wage?

OR

Distribute the K-W-L chart and have students complete the first two columns to the best of their ability. (Have them revise their answers and fill in the last column after viewing the video.)

Viewing Guide:

It is recommended that teachers show the video segment twice: once to allow students to view the video and focus on the issues presented, and once to allow them time to complete the viewing guide. After they complete the viewing guide, allow students a few minutes to work in pairs sharing and verifying answers.

- 3. Why might some people support raising the minimum wage? Why might some people oppose raising it?
- 4. Do the benefits of raising the minimum wage outweigh the costs? Explain.
- 5. How many of you have a job? Do you consider it an entry-level job? What would be the consequences if your employer were forced to pay you \$15/hour? What about \$20/hour? What about \$25? Is there a pattern here?
- 6. Why might a \$15/hour minimum wage discourage business owners from hiring beginners?
- 7. If you received a raise because of an increase in minimum wage and your co-worker and friend lost her job, what would you say? What if you lost your job and your friend got the raise?

- 9. Why did the small business owner stop hiring and training young people?

Activities:

- 1. Distribute the Minimum Wage Hurts Beginners PMI Chart and have students complete it after watching the video or for homework.
- 2. Show the class FEE's video, "Who Is the Minimum Wage Really Protecting?" https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ordzgpuw4Mk&vl=en
- 3. Produce a "man-on-the-street" video in which you ask people what they think about raising the minimum wage. Then, ask them to what positive effects might result and what negative effects might result from an increase in the minimum wage.
- 4. Research and create a slideshow presentation that explains the positive and negative effects of raising the minimum wage. Be sure to include real-life examples.
- 5. Interview several small business owners about how an increase in minimum wage would likely affect their business. Share your findings in a written, oral, slide show, or video summary.

- 6. Interview several minimum wage jobholders. Be sure to interview workers of different ages, family size, education levels, etc. What explains why they are working in a minimum wage job? How might an increase in minimum wage affect their employment status and their life? Share your findings in a written, oral, slide show, or video summary. For extra credit, try to determine why some workers advance beyond minimum wage or entry-level jobs and others do not.
- 7. Research minimum wages in all 50 states, and select several states with the highest and lowest minimum wage. Then, compare the standard of living in those states. Do your findings support either a state-by-state approach to minimum wage or a national minimum wage? Share your findings in an essay, oral presentation, or slide show.
- 8. Research and report on the reasons Iceland, Norway, Sweden, and Switzerland do not have a minimum wage. What are their unemployment rates? How do their unemployment rates compare with other European countries? Share your findings in a slide show or oral presentation, or on a poster board.
- 9. Amazon now pays its employees at least \$15/hour. Further, it has announced support for a \$15 minimum wage nationwide. A) Research the differences a minimum wage increase would have on big companies vs small companies, or B) Research Amazon's investments in robotics and AI that will help them reduce the number of employees. For both A and B, determine if Amazon is being altruistic or if it is a tactic designed to help Amazon at the expense of its competition.
- 10. Conduct a classroom debate on increasing the minimum wage.
- 11. Take Cornell Notes (two-column notes) as you read one of the following articles, or write a summary of one of the following articles.

- 12. Write and produce a 30-second public service announcement (PSA) in which you support or oppose increasing the minimum wage in your city or state. Be sure to advocate strongly for the side you take, using evidence to support your position. The PSA may be presented as a video (TV spot), audio (radio spot), slide show, or on a storyboard. The PSA may be a group or individual project.
- 13. Conduct research on current entry level job data in an effort to answer to these questions: What age group tends to fill these jobs? How long have the workers been employed? Are the jobholders pursuing other careers or education? Are these workers skilled or unskilled? What conclusions can you draw from the data?
- 14. Write a persuasive essay in which you explain the arguments for and against raising the minimum wage in the United States, or in your city or state, and take a position on whether it should be raised.
